## B.Y.O.B. Key Points:

* Sta tute requires resta urant, dining room or other public place where food or liquid refreshments are sold or served to the general public.
* Wine or a malt alc oholic beverages only.
* No cover, corka ge or service charge.
* No advertising B.Y.O.B. inside or outside.

* Ca nnot allow the consumption of wine or malt alcoholic beveragesat timesor by personsto whom the senvice or consumption of a lc oholic beverages on licensed premises is prohibited by State or munic ipal law or regulation.
* Munic ipality may prohibit the consumption of alc oholic beverages on those premises.
* A person who violatesthe B.Y.O.B. statute is a disorderly person.


## Scenario \# 1: There is a very popular "Paint \& Sip" in your

 town which allows customers to B.Y.O.B. wine and beer to consume while painting. It this allowed?
A. Yes, as long as B.Y.O.B. is allowed in your town.
B. No, because the statute allows B.Y.O.B. at a restaurant or dining room.
C. Yes, as long as the Paint \& Sip does not serve the alcoholic beverage.
D. No, because they did not geta Social Affair Pemit

* B.Y.O.B. is for wine and beer only.
* It is NOTa Division of ABC issue. Call Munic ipal or County Prosec utor for advice and information.
* Violators can be charged with a Disorderly Person's Offense. Talk to your local Police Department
* Only Restaurants are permitted B.Y.O.B as of now.
* ANSWER: "B"

Scenario \#2: A local hair salon has signs posted stating "Bridal Parły Special: Hair, Makeup \& Free Champagne." Can they give away a free glass of Champagne?

A. Yes, because they are notselling it-- the champagne is free.
B. Yes, if they have the proper permit
C. No, because they do not have a liquorlicense.
D. No, because it is not offered to all clients.


## Remember:

* 

UnderTitle 33, this is a sale of alcoholic beverages, and the hair salon does not have a liquor license.
*
Munic ipal or County Prosecutor has the authority to prosecute disorderly persons offenses.

- The Division of ABC can only prosec ute liquor licensees or permitees.
- ANSWER: "C"

Scenario \#3: "Jose's Cantina," an un-licensed restaurant, offers a complimentary glass of wine or shot of Sambuca to you. Is this o.k.?

B. Yes, as long as its free.
C. Yes, as long as its less than a sample size of 10z.
D. No, because they do nothave a liquor license and are not permitted to sell, seve or deliveralcoholic beverages, even if it is complimentary.

## Remember:

They may allow B.Y.O.B. (if permitted by municipality) which is for beer and wine only, but they cannot offer complimentary alcoholic beverages.

* It is NOTa Division of ABC issue.

Violators can be charged with a Disorderly Person's Offense.

- Only Restaurants are permitted B.Y.O.B as of now.
- ANSWER "D"

Scenario \#4: An Italian Restaurant, which does not hold a liquor license, is allowing its patrons to bring wine and/or beer into the restaurant to enjoy while eating. They provide glasses and ice to the customers. Is this allowable?

A. Yes, as long as the local municipality does not have an ordinance prohibiting B.Y.O.B., and the patrons are at least 21 years old.
B. Yes, as long as they do not charge a corkage fee and it is during hours that sales of alcoholic beverages are allowed.
C. Yes, as long as patrons do not bring distilled spirits or mixed drinks.
D. Yes, as long as they do notadvertise B.Y.O.B.
E. All of the above.

## B.Y.O.B. STATUTE (N.J.S.A. 2C:33-27) States:

A. No person who owns or operates a restaurant dining room or other public place where food or liquid refieshments are sold orsenved to the ceneral public, and for which premises a license or pemit authoizing the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption has not been issued:

1. Shall allow the consumption of alcoholic beverages, other than wine ora maltalcoholic beverage, in a portion of the premises which is open to the public; or
2. Shall charge any admission fee or cover, corkage orsenice charge or advertise inside or outide of such premises that patrons may bring and consume their own wine or malt alcoholic beverages in a portion of the premises which is open to the public; or
3. Shall allow the consumption of wine or maltalcoholic beverages at times or by persons to whom the service or consumption of alcoholic beverages on licensed premises is prohibited by State ormunicipal law orregulation.
B. Nothing in this act shall restict the right of a municipality or an owner or operator of a restaurant, dining room or other public place where food or liquid refieshments are sold or served to the general public from prohibiting the consumption of alcoholic beverages on those premises.
C. A person who violates any provision of this actis a disordelly person, and the court, in addition to the sentence imposed for the disorderly persons violation, may, by its judgment, bar the owner or operatorfiom allowing consumption of wine or maltalcoholic beverages in his premises as authorized by this act

## GROWLERS

"Growlers" are usually a glass or ceramic containerwith a screw on cap ora hinged gasket cap that contains fresh beer.


Growlers were very popularafter Prohibition ended.

With the increasing populanity of craft beers, growlers are becoming popularagain.



- Package goods store licensees cannot fill growlers. A holder of a "44" license MAY NOT sell or fill growlers.
- Growlers can only be filled by an on-premise consumption licensee. A licensee have a "33" or "32" license to sell or fill growlers.

Scenario \#5: A packaged goods store licensee that holds a " 32 " license wants to sell growlers. Can they?

A. Yes,"32" licenses are allowed to sell growlers.
B. Yes, "32" licenses can sell growlers only if they have a bar.
C. No, "32" licenses are not allowed to sell growlers.
D. Yes, "32" lic enses can sell growlers as long as they are consumed on the licensed premises.

Remember:
" 32 " licenses can operate as ("either-or, or both") a consumption licensee, a packaged goods store license, or both with no restrictions.

* Note: "33" licenses may sell packaged goods and may look similarto a "44" or "32" lic ense. don't make determinations about growlers based on the way the premises looks-- be sure to check what type of license they hold. Check the license number!
* ANSWER: "A"


## License Renewal

## All licenses must be renewed annually

Retail Licenses
July 1st June 30th


## Winter Seasonal

November 15th thru May 1st

## Summer Seasonal

May 1st thru November 15th (This year, by Executive Order, the Govemor granted Seasonal licenses the ability to open on March 1st)

## Renewal Procedures:

> Application and fees must be filed by the licensee

> All licenses expire on J une $30^{\text {th }}$ and are required to be renewed on a timely basis

RENEWAL MAY NOTBE GRANIED BY RESOLUION PRIORTO MAY 1st

NOIE: Applications may not be approved withoutan Alcoholic Beverage Retail license Clearance Certicate for Renewal fiom the Division of taxation

## "POSSE ABC"

## What is "POSSEABC?"

POSSE ABC is a web-based system that utilizes a portal for Municipal Cleiks/ABC Secretaries and Iqquorlicensees to manage theirlicenses online. POSSE ABC will ultimately reduce work load, minimize effort and streamline the renewal process.

## What does it do?

It changes the way municipalities, licensees and the Division of ABC interact with each other, and will bring ABC licensing into the 21st century. We anticipate that it will take time forall parties to become accustomed to the modemization of our licensing process.

This system is also new to the Division of ABC, and we mustall work together to reap the benefits of POSSE ABC.

## "POSSE ABC continued..."

The Posse ABC System will be implemented in phases.

## Phase 1 is RENEWALS only!

Every municipality will have a "primary" municipal user who will access the municipal portal.

## The Division will begin a new renewal process for the 2015-2016 license tem.

You should have received a letterfrom the State Division of ABC asking fora "Municipal User" e-mail address.


On a daily basis, you should check the Division's Website www.ni.gov/oac/abc for updates, information, instructions and tutorials.

NOTE: Licensees will sill pay renewal fees to the cleik of your municipality. The clerk is still required to review renewal applications.

Does the resolution include Special Conditions?

## Iicensees will receive a Notice with instuctions for renewal.

- Their Notice will include an authorization code to register online to become a User of Posse.
- Notices will also refiect (and contain instructions for):
- whether they require a $\mathbf{1 2 . 3 9}$ Special Ruling, or
- whether their license will be treated as a "confict of interest," or
- whether they failed to file a 2014-2015 renewal application.
- Once a licensee is registered as an online user, they can review their information and complete the renewal process which includes payment of the $\$ 200$ State Fee.
-They are then directed to go to your ofice to pay their municipal fee to be considered a complete filing.

Change in facts- You must file an Amendment to your license application within 10 days.

* Becoming inactive/closing
* Becoming active/opening
* Change of home address/ phone number
* Any fact that is associated with a license and listed on POSSE ABC, must be updated by the licensee via a paperamendment and forwarded to ABC and Issuing Authority within 10 days of the occumence. N.J.A.C. 13:2-2.14


## License Cerificates

## Certificates will be available for printing by Municipal Clerks once the Resolution is uploaded and sent to the Division of ABC.

## Municipal Clerks will print and distribute to all licensees.



Certificates for inactive licenses should be retained in your office until that time the license goes active.

## Renewal Resolutions General Guidelines

All Resolutions should c lea rly list:

* License Number
* Licensee Name
* Licensed Premise Location
* Language Relating to Special Rulings (if a p plic a ble)
* License Renewal Term
* Date Adopted


## Renewal Resolutions

o Once a resolution is adopted, forward to the Division.

- Your issuing a uthority ha s no jurisd ic tion to act on the renewal of license without an Alc oholic Beverage Reta il Licensee Clearance Certificate for Renewal from the Division of Taxation.
> Check your confidential Web address
> Municipal Clerks may contact the Division of Taxation's ABC Lic ensing Unit at (609) 292-0043
> It is the licensee who must be in tax compliance.
- Licenses will not be considered renewed by ABC until your Resolution has been received by the Division.


## Municipal Resolutions with Special Conditions

Resolution must specific ally include any Special Conditions that are to be applied to the license for that license term only.


## Conditions may not be imposed formatters not directly related to alcoholic beverage control.

For Special Conditions to become effective, they must be imposed at the time of
issuance, renewal or transfer of a license.

Special Conditions may not be "revisited" during the license term, however, a Special Condition may be "relaxed" at any time during the license term by Resolution.

Copies of Resolutions imposing Special Conditions must be submitted to the Division.

## Special Conditions - The Good, the Bad and the Ugly!

## Good examples:

1. The licensee may not have or conductany Teen, College or Hip Hop Dance Nights on the premises.
2. Alcoholic beverages may not be sold, sewed, delivered or consumed on the open exterior deck of the premises.

## Bad examples:

1. A six month review shall be conducted by the police division to see if provisions are effective and if further restictions are necessary.
2. See special conditions set forth in Resolution \#2078 adopted November 10, 1999.
3. Failure to comply with special conditions shall constitute an automatic revocation of license.
4. The hours of sales of alc oholic beverages shall be limited from sunise to sunset

## Transfer Facts

A person-to-person transfer is necessary when:

## A license is to change from one person orentity to another.

## Transfer Facts

## A place-to-place transfer is necessary when a licensee wishes to:

* 

Change the place where the license is sited (business location)

* Ste the license at an operating place of business following a period of inactivity "pocketed" (not sited ata business location)
* Permanently expand the scope of the license premises
* De-license a portion of the premises


## Transfer Facts (continued...)

For a PLACE-TO-PLACE EXPANSION particular attention needs to be given to:

The area in which the licensee wishes to extend must be contiguous or adjoin the permanently licensed premises.

It is possible for a licensee to expand the licensed premises to more than one building on a property.

## All locations must be under

 the control of the same legal entity although different registered trade names may be used for each building.NOTE: A voluntary abandonment of all of the licensed premises shall be a change of facts (amendment). A place-to-place transfer is notrequired. N.J.A.C. 13:2-7.2(d).

## Transfer Requirements:

## NOTICE OF PUBLICATION

- needed for all types of transfers.



## CONSENT TO TRANSFER

- only needed for PERSON-TO-PERSON transfers.


## TRANSFER TAX CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE

- only needed for PERSON-TO-PERSON transfers.

Note: The issuing authority has no jurisdiction to consider a person-to-person transfer applic ation without a Consent to Transfer or receipt of a Tax Clearance Certificate.

Scencrio \#7: Tracy's Tavern, LLC, files a person-ło-person transfer with your office. Licensee is fingerprinted and publishes notice. Tracy's Tavern, LLC, wants to operate licensed premises ASAP. Can you now transfer this license?

A. Yes. Pass a resolution that states "transfer is contingent upon tax clearance."
B. Yes. Pass a resolution that states "transfer is contingent upon ABC approval."
C. Yes. Pass a resolution that states "transfer is contingent upon closing between the two parties."
D. All of the above.
E. None of the above.
*
The text should be conclusive and may not be contingent upon future events.

Once approved, a license transfer cannot be reversed.
To comectan improperly transferred license, a new transfer procedure must be completed.

Forward resolution to the Licensing Bureau as soon as enacted by the issuing authority. (Via the municipal portal when Phase 2 is implemented.)

Division of ABC does not approve transfers.

## Transfer Investigations by Municipality

- Investigation by the issuing authority should include:
> fingerprinting
> a criminal background check
> fina ncial disc losure doc umentation

THIS INVESTIGATION SHOULD BE C ONDUCTED BY THE POLCE DEPARTMENT. (N.J.A.C. 13:2-7.7)

## Corporate Strucłure Change

- When a change in the corporate stockholdings of a licensed corporation occurs, that change must be reported to the issuing authority within ten (10) days of the sale of the corporation's shares.
- This action does not constitute a license transfer but is handled as a change in corporate structure.
o Changes encompassing one-third or more of the total number of issued shares, the change must be reported by the filing of a complete 12-page application.
- Changes constituting less than onethird of the total issued shares, the change is reported by amending the lastapplication on file.


## Corporate Strucłure Change (continued...)

## Any new stockholder:

1. Must be fully qualified to hold an alcoholic beverage license
2. If acquiring $\mathbf{1 \%}$ or more of the coporations stock must publish in a newspaper of local circulation
-Individuals name \& address
-Name of licensed corporation

No filing fee is required

A copy of the application must be forwarded to the licensing Bureau

No requirement to approve a stockholder change by resolution


## New License Issuance

A municipality may issue a new license if they are under the population cap．

See N．J．S．A．33：2－12．14


The two methods to issue a new license：
1．Historical Method
2．Public Sale Option（bid）

## Club License

## Club licenses are a source of many inquiries and complaints at the Division.

## Many Club licenses operate contrary to law.

Club licenses MAY NOToperate as a retail licensee.


They MAY NOTbe open to the general public.

## Ad Interim Permit

- An application for an Ad Interim permit may be submitted to the Division when:
> a license is not renewed by the issuing municipality by resolution on time to be effective on the first day of the new license term
> and the licensee hasfiled the renewal application
> paid the filing fees
- The permit will allow the licensed business to operate until the munic ipal issuing authority can meet and renew the license by resolution.


## Ad Interim Permit (continued...)

- The application must be accompanied by:
> a letterfrom the Municipal Clerk/ABC Board Secretary indicating that the application and fees have been filed and that there is no objection to issuance of the temporary pemit
- The fee for this permit is $\$ 75$ plus the daily fee of $\$ 5$ perday payable to the Division of $A B C$.
- The application must be completed in full.
- The licensee must have obtained a clearance certificate from the Division of Taxation before the permit will be issued.


## Social Affair Permit

- Fee Schedule:
> \$100 for a one-day permit issued to
- civic
- religious
- educational orga nizations

> $\$ 150$ for a one-day permit issued to
- a ny other non-profit orga nization
- Issued to a bona fide, non-profit organization that wishes to hold a fundraising event that encompasses the sale of alcoholic beveragesand where the moniesthat accrue will be used for civic, religious, educational or other pupposes that are not for personal or profit making corporate gain.


## Social Affair Permit (continued...)

- This permit is frequently issued to a uthorize the sale and senvice of alcoholic beveragesat:
- camivals
- church feasts
- bazaars
- parades, etc.
- No organization may receive more than 12 such one-day permits in any calendar year.
o No more than $\underline{25}$ permits may be issued at a location in a calendaryear.
- The permittee may sell alc oholic beverages only in open containers for consumption on the premises at which the event is to be held and which is covered by the permit issued.


## Social Affair Permit (continued...)

Orga niza tions making online a p plic ation for the first time will be required to submit:
> proof of non-profit status in New J ersey

Acceptable forms of proof are:
Non-Profft
Organizations
> certificate of incorporation
> federaltax exempt certificate
> orcombinations of:

- Charter or by-la ws
- Financial records
- Membership lists


## Social Affair Permit (continued...)

- A sketch of the location where alcoholic beveragesare to be dispensed must a c company the a pplic ation including:
- the bararea
- location of person checking ID's

*NOTE: APPICATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE DIVISION AT LEAST TWO WEEKS PRIOR TO THE AFFAIR.

Scenario \#8: John Smith is a member of the VFW which holds a Club License. He has rented the facility to have a 50 th wedding anniversary party for his parents. What will John need to do to serve alcoholic beverages to his family and friends at this event?

A. He is able to purchase alcohol from the club licensee's inventory.
B. He does not need to obtain a pemit
C. He can hire a licensed restaurant to cater the food and alcoholic beverages for the party.

* J ohn Smith is a member of the club.
* The party is for his immediate family member.
* It will be a private party - no tickets will be sold.
* ANSWER: "D"

Scencrio \#9: The Make-A-Wish Foundation wants to hold a fundraising event for a sick child. They are selling tickets for the event which includes food and alcoholic beverages. What do they need to obtain for this event?

B. A Social Affair Permit if the event is at a licensed premises.
C. A Social Affair Permit if the event is at a non-licensed premises.
D. A Social Affair Permit no matter where the event is being held.
*
They are a non-profit, holding an event where tickets are sold and alc oholic beverages are included.

To sell alcoholic beverages (and profit), they need a permit

* ANSWER: "D"


## Extension of Premises Permit

- When the licensee wishesto hold an event in an area off the lic ensed premises but on property that is contiguous to
o Online application includes: > information regarding the nature of the event
> the location
> date a nd time
- Upload a rough drawn sketch depicting the extended area asit adjoins the licensed premises

- The fee for this permit is $\$ 75$ perday payable to the Division


## Catering Permit

An online a pplic ation must be submitted when:

- A retail consumption lic ensee wishes to sell a lc oholic beverages in open conta iners off its lic ensed premises.
- The fee is $\$ 100$ perday (for each 24 hour period).
- Only 25 permits may be issued for any one location in a calendaryear.
- A detailed sketch of the locations where alcoholic beverages are to be dispensed including: the bararea and location of person checking ID's


## *NOTE APPIICATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE DIVISION AT LEAST TWO WEEKS PRIOR TO THE EVENT.

## Disciplinary Matters

Problem licensee - what can you do?
Call our Investigations Bureau toll firee at (866) 713 -8392, or speak to your local chief of police or your mayor.

Local police can charge licensees with violations. Have the police department call our Enforcement Bureau for further information.

Impose Special Conditions on the license at time of renewal, issuance or tansfer to curtail specific problems at a licensed premises.
