New Jersey State Vital Records:

New Jersey State Vital Records begin in May 1848. The New Jersey State Archives has all New Jersey State Vital Records for May 1848 – Dec. 1915. The New Jersey State Archives issues State Seal certified copies of these vital records.

Through an agreement with the State Bureau of Vital Statistics, the State Archives maintains State Vital Records that are over 100 years old. Every January 1, an additional year of Vital Records are transferred from the State Bureau of Vital Statistics to the New Jersey State Archives. For example on January 1, 2016 the State Bureau of Vital Statistics transferred State Vital Records for 1915 to the New Jersey State Archives.

## **Processing of Vital Records at the New Jersey State Archives:**

Earliest New Jersey State Vital Records – May 1848 to May 1878.

These are not individual certificates, but very large oversized bound volumes.

As an ongoing project, these volumes are receiving extensive conservation treatment. The State Archives has been working with CCAHA [Conservation Center for Art and Historic Artifacts in Phila. – Disbound, cleaned, mended, re-housed in acid-free folders and boxes. Then microfilmed by our in-house staff.

#### Vital Records – June 1878 to 1915 – Individual certificate format

Vital Records come to us usually as disbound volumes, and tightly packed in cubic foot boxes.

We re-house vital records into acid free boxes, and acid free folders.

For torn vital records can be placed in a Mylar sleeve (Mylar is an inert plastic which does not interact with the paper document. Mylar sleeves com with one folded edge or as an "L" sleeve with two joined edges.)

Vital Records that have not been microfilmed our microfilm by our in-house staff.
